## **OXNARD, CALIF., Celebrates 10th Anniversary Historic Downtown Tour**

Encompassing 144 homes with an additional 600 architecturally significant homes in the surrounding neighborhood, the Henry T. Oxnard Historic District has the highest percentage of contributing structures among historic districts in California. Built by wealthy residents after Henry Oxnard and his brothers opened the American Beet Sugar factory in the late 1800s, some of the homes date back to 1903. On the 10th anniversary of this event on Sept. 24, in addition to tours of six period homes, the Friends of Old Oxnard will present guided walking tours of the revitalized downtown, featuring Ventura County's last remaining public bandstand, the Carnegie Art Museum, and a recently restored Woolworth's Department store. Antiques, revival furnishings and decorative arts vendors will exhibit. From 10 a.m. to 6 p.m., G and F Streets between Magnolia and Fifth Streets. Tickets are \$15 in advance or \$20 at the door.
